#### Did You Know Flea and Heartworm Season is Almost Here?

Yes, it is unfortunately true. As spring and summer arrive so do the mosquitoes, fleas, ticks, and other parasites. This is your official reminder to bring your dog in for a simple blood test to detect any exposure to any mosquitoes carrying heartworm disease from last year. Every year numerous dogs die from this easily preventable disease. Many of our clients have already had their pet tested this year and are well ahead of the game.

Heartworm and flea prevention starts June 1, 2009 and continues for 6 months until November 1, 2009. There are a number of safe products available to help keep your pet parasite free this summer including Revolution, Sentinel, and Advantage Multi amongst others. The options can be confusing and every dog or cat has a different amount of exposure to these parasites. Some products offer heartworm OR flea control only, while others provide full prevention from heartworm, fleas, ticks, mange, and intestinal parasites (e.g. Revolution). # SafePet Program

For over a year now we have been actively involved in the OVMA's SafePet Program. This voluntary program has allowed us to provide temporary housing and care for the numerous pets of women who have used the services of the various women's shelters across Niagara.

The program was developed by the OVMA (Ontario Veterinary Medical Association) after some alarming statistics were revealed:



48% of surveyed Ontario women who had left their abusive partner said their pets delayed their decision to leave the abusive partner. (OSPCA 1998)



61% of surveyed Ontario women who had left their abusive partner stated that their partners had brutalized or killed a pet. (OSPCA 1998)

Making that final decision to leave an abusive partner is a difficult but vital one. With the SafePet Program, not only can women make this decision, they can make it more quickly and with ease. All of us at Morgan Animal Hospital are honoured to assist by caring for their beloved pet until they have found permanent housing to bring their pet to join them again.

# What's New at Morgan Animal Hospital

Keeping up with the advances in technology is not an easy task. Just ask anyone with a teenager at home, and they are well aware of all the "must have" gizmos. Keeping up with medical knowledge and technology is very important to help us provide your pet with the best possible care. Over the past year we purchased 2 new pieces of equipment that do just that.



The first is a new PanOptic-Ophthalmoscope that allows us to easily look at the fundus (the visual center at the back of the eye) of dogs and cats. It gives us an instant panoramic view of the back of the eye to look for any evidence of disease without causing any discomfort or stress to your pet.

Dr. Morgan has been performing endoscopy (a special medical camera) for veterinary clinics all across the Niagara Region and Western New York for approximately 12 years now. We recently upgraded one of

our flexible endoscopes to a cutting edge video-endoscope which allows us to visualize the esophagus, stomach, intestines, and lungs of patients with a clear digital image. Beyond the dramatically clearer image, the scope is also incredibly user friendly and allows us to perform these procedures more efficiently and provides better diagnostic and therapeutic value to our clients.
