It is Heartworm and Flea Reminder Time

Yes, it is unfortunately true. As spring and summer approaches so do the mosquitoes, fleas, ticks, and other parasites. This is your official reminder to bring your dog in for a simple blood test to detect any exposure to any mosquitoes carrying Heartworm disease from last year. Every year numerous dogs die from this easily preventable disease. Heartworm disease is still quite rare in cats; however fleas are very common in both dogs and cats (even indoor ones), as are intestinal parasites.

Heartworm and flea prevention should start June 1, 2010 and continue for 6 months until November 1, 2010. There are a number of safe and effective products available to help keep your pet parasite free this summer; these include Revolution, Sentinel, and Advantage Multi amongst others. The options can be confusing and every dog or cat has a different amount of exposure to these parasites. Some products offer heartworm OR flea control, while others provide full prevention from heartworm, fleas, ticks, mange, and intestinal parasites (e.g. Revolution). Comfortis



There have not been many new products in Canada for flea control over the last few years, until now. Comfortis was released in Canada this spring but has been used extensively in the USA for years. Unfortunately it is licensed for dogs only, but it is the first beef flavoured chewable tablet that begins to kill fleas within 30 minutes, it kills 100% of fleas within 4 hours of administration and lasts for 1 month. Due to the rapid action, it also prevents eggs from being laid in the environment. Sentinel is

another chewable heartworm and flea control. It is a fantastic option for preventing heartworm disease and some intestinal parasites, however it only prevents adult fleas from laying viable eggs, while the adult will still live on the

pet and cause irritation. Advantage and Revolution are also excellent flea control products and are applied topically. Some people prefer the ease of topical products while others prefer tablets. The benefits of Comfortis are the rapid onset of action, no mess on the skin, and swimming or bathing will not reduce its efficacy unlike some topical products. It is safe for puppies over 14 weeks of age and although side effects are very rare, the most common one is vomiting. It is also not recommended for any dogs that have a history of epilepsy.
